WFP Walk the World Yokohama Date: May 24th (Sun) 9:30 -Venue: Yokohama Minato Mirai Participants: 4000 persons (2000 persons 5 kilometer course, 2000 persons 10 kilometer course)

At the Mitsui Chemicals exhibition booth, the Group will display its hybrid rice, Mitsuhikari and its film and packaging product, Spash[™] which helps retain food freshness.
